The Breck School's Katherine Solohub selected Class A Herb Brooks Award Winner

ST. PAUL, Minn. --- Katherine Solohub, a senior defender on The Breck School's girls' hockey team, was selected the Class A recipient of the Herb Brooks Award during the Minnesota State High School League's Girls Hockey State Tournament at the Xcel Energy Center.



The award recognizes a state tournament participant that strongly represents the values, characteristics and traits that defined Herb Brooks, a St. Paul native and world hockey icon.

"Katherine exemplifies the definition of integrity each day," Breck coach Keith Radloff said. "When Katherine shows up for practice each day, she often leads the team onto the ice and sets the tone . . . Katherine's honest approach when working with her teammates and coaches, during both positive and challenging conversations, is always centered around high moral principles and value to the team."

Solohub, an academic all-state selection with a 3.83 grade-point average, helped lead the Mustangs to the Class A championship for the second consecutive season. In addition to her hockey excellence, she is committed to volunteering in the community. Her involvement and support work include time spent at the Atrebla Early Learning Center in Minneapolis, the Community Emergency Assistance Programs facility (CEAP) in Brooklyn Park and the Anderson United Community School in Minneapolis, where PRIDE (Perseverance, Respect, Integrity, Determination and Excellence) are targeted values.

Solohub plans to continue her academic and hockey career at Hamilton College in Clinton, N.Y.

She will receive a \$1,000 scholarship from the Herb Brooks Foundation.
